Student dues will be increased from \$6 to \$10. Student transfers will remain \$10.



SAE is indeed an international society with more than 3,500 members in 87 countries outside North America who receive a special quarterly issue of SAE UPdate produced for and distributed exclusively to offshore members. In fact, the word "international" has been adopted as part of the SAE logo (see attachment).

SAE has a network of international advisors serving 21 countries, including Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Israel, Italy, Japan, Korea, Netherlands, Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and the United Kingdom. These individuals provide a vital communication link between SAE and offshore members.

SAE collaborates with societies worldwide to organize international meetings. This year SAE held a joint conference on Subzero Engineering with SATL of Finland in Rovaniemi and co-sponsored a Small Engine Technology Conference with SAE-Japan in Milwaukee. Next year SAE will co-sponsor the 1990 Air Cargo Forum in New Delhi. SAE works to harmonize automotive and aerospace standards with ANSI, ISO and other groups worldwide.
